Agenda Item 1. Filipino-American Development Foundation (12:00 PM)

Ms. Borja Sy stated that a needs assessment was done and that it does show a need to fill some of the service gaps in the South of Market. **M.C.** from the Healthy Start Program at Bessie Carmichael was contracted to do the research. They will invoice the Redevelopment Agency as soon as the work and outline have been completed. The next step is to hire a coordinator for the FADF program and then to take the needs assessment. **Ms. Borja Sy** stated that she has volunteered as the coordinator until someone is selected as the new coordinator. She stated that they have combined previous survey with the one done by **M. C. Canlas**. The area that they have found to be most pressing is one of economic need. Job training to get a better job would be one solution for such a person, and also looking into developing programs and not just referrals. **Ms. Borja Sy** stated that a request to Health and Human Services has been filled out for a space study of the new project at the Delta.

Agenda Item 2. Goals and Objectives (12:35 PM)

The Goals and Objectives have been gone over in almost all of the other Committees. The changes to the Goals and Objectives have been edited and reviewed by most of the sub-committees. In this meeting, the discussion went to defining the wording of all of the summaries of each of the categories and the Human Services went on to define some changes in their own financing. A Vision of 6th Street was incorporated with the Goals and Objectives and it was recommended that the Vision be one that can be seen in the future as well as now and a Vision that includes Safety, Clean well lit areas and widening the streets.

Agenda Item 3. Bessie Carmichael School and Park Report (12:56 PM)

There was also a mention of the new Bessie Carmichael and the need for a long term Filipino learning or school system. As the new school is being built, it would make it a necessity to make FEC a full-time multi-year experience for the students instead of just one year and then mainstreamed into a regular school.

No other items were discussed at this meeting.
